THIRTY FIRST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Malachi 1:14b-2:2b, 8-10 This passage from Malachi denounces the laxity and unfaithfulness of the people and especially of the priests, who failed in their duties to God and their neighbors.

Second Reading: 1 Thessalonians 2:7b-9, 13 Paul reminisces about his extremely happy and successful visit with the Thessalonians. He praises them once again for their immediate and open acceptance of his message as truly the word of God.

Gospel: Matthew 23:1-12 In a strongly worded message, Jesus again rebukes the Pharisees for the hypocritical ostentation and love of honor and position. He reminds the people and the disciples that the truly greatest one is the one who serves others. He ends with the words, "Whoever exalts himself shall be humbled, but whoever humbles himself shall be exalted"

ST. MARTIN OF TOURS

Martin was born in Pannonia (modern Hungary), and became a catechumen at the age of ten. While serving in the Roman Army, he met a poor, half-clothed man outside the city gate of Amiens. Martin drew his sword and divided his own cloak in two, giving half to the naked man. That night, he saw Jesus in a vision. "Martin, who is still but a catechumen, give me this robe," our Lord told the angels. After this, Martin "flew to be baptized." After he resigned from the army, he founded a monastic community in Gaul (modern France). In 372 he was elected Bishop of Tours, where he served his flock with great care until his death in 397.

WHY DO CATHOLICS DO THAT? WHY DO CATHOLICS SIT, STAND, AND KNEEL DURING MASS?

We adopt different postures throughout the Mass to help us focus, and each posture means something different. We sit during the homily and the readings to help us listen. We stand during the Gospel, and when the priest enters and leaves, to show him honor and respect when he represents Christ. Finally, we kneel at the Consecration in adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, because Christ, himself, is present. These actions are intended to engage both our bodies and our minds in prayer.
